RE: APPOINTMENT TO DEPUTY SHERIFFS' CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION TO A TWO (2) YEAR TERM

Robert L. Bailey, Commissioner, moved to approve the appointment of Charles McComas to the Cabell County Deputy Sheriffs' Civil Service Commission.

The motion died due to lack of a second.

Anne Yon, Commissioner, moved to approve the appointment of Chris Miller to the Cabell County Deputy Sheriffs' Civil Service Commission.

Robert L. Bailey, Commissioner, stated he believed the person filling the position had to be of the same political affiliation as the vacating member. Commissioner Bailey asked County Attorney William Watson for his opinion on the matter.

William Watson, County Attorney, stated he believed the statue dictated that no more than two members from the same political party could serve on the Commission. Mr. Watson stated he believed that to be the only rule regarding party affiliation.

Robert L. Bailey, Commissioner, stated he did not understand why the other members of the Commission would choose to appoint an individual who regularly made a mockery of himself on television. Commissioner Bailey explained he felt the main concern of the Commission should be finding a candidate whose main priority would be to protect the interests of the deputies.

Nancy Cartmill, President, stated she agreed the main priority should be to select an individual who would represent the deputies to the best of their ability.
